

Joining forces to create a unique 'wall of sound'

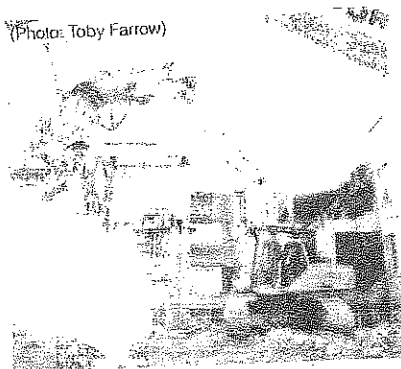
The Colston Hall and Remix, the Bristol Youth Music Action Zone, are asking talented young people to come forward and help transform the venue's hoardings into works of art.

While the Colston Hall is undergoing development work, it is hoped that the exterior of the site can be turned into an interesting place to be.

In order to do this, Remix and the Colston Hall are looking for 10 young people between the ages of 11 and 16 to make a unique sound installation as part of the hoardings.

Working alongside members of installation practitioners Push Me Buttons And Twiddle Me Knobs, the young people will learn all about

building a sound installation.

Workshops will include making interactive buttons, sampling sounds,

using music technology programmes, learning to use midi controllers, creating a huge range of sound effects and working on the design of the installation.

This is not just a project for budding musicians and electricians – it's an opportunity to get involved in helping to create a multi-layered, sonic graffiti wall for the people of Bristol to enjoy.

Those who want to get involved will need to be free on Saturday afternoons between 2pm and 5pm, from November 3 to December 15.
